History

1997 – Communitech established by founders

2010 – Communitech Hub at the Tannery; \$500K investment

2016 – Communitech capital expansion; \$300K/year over 5 years

2021 – Business recovery; \$500K/year over 3 years



Partnership Request

 Communitech is requesting annual funding of \$500,000 from 2024 – 2027

 City of Kitchener Funding is used to leverage senior levels of government (ex: FedDev)



Pandemic Impact - Communitech

Communitech had to change to virtual service model

Founders/companies located both within and outside of region

 Reduced the funnel of scaling companies that have the potential to locate in office space in Downtown Kitchener



Pandemic Impact – Downtown Kitchener

 Companies changed their office model – fully remote, hybrid, reduced footprint, etc.

 Impact to DTK is 1M sq ft of empty office space representing 27% vacancy impacting the downtown vibrancy

Pipeline of onsite scaling companies needs to be re-established



New Programming 2024 - Communitech

 New City-funded programming is to be onsite, in person at the Communitech Hub

Regenerate the future office pipeline for DTK

Funding has been allocated to specific programs

Proposed Programming (Investment Shown is Annual)

1) Supporting Founders exploring entrepreneurship (\$200,000)

- Create and execute a combination of community outreach and a series of discovery and validation stage programs for earlystage tech startups
- Incubate 450 new startups annually, with the number of new startup companies to be reported quarterly and annually.
- One new Startup Program Manager, one part-time contractor, one half time program coordinator to be added



6) Fierce Founders (\$200,000)

- Support underrepresented founders;
 - 30 companies through Bootcamps;
 - 10-15 companies per year focused on pre-validation, idea refinement and identifying potential markets;
 - One-on-one coaching;
- Deliver 'Uplift'
 - 7-month program
 - 10 companies with each receiving \$10,000
- Deliver 'Intensive Track'
 - 9-12 month program
 - 10 companies focused on finding product market fit, growing revenue and investment attraction.



9) Make It Kitchener Coworking Area & Recognition

(no additional investment required by the City)

- Communitech will establish a coworking area within the Hub, branded Make It Kitchener
- Free workspace for Founders of City-supported programs
- Participant awarenessof the City's support for these programs.

Expectations for City-funded Programs

- Communitech would prioritize:
 - Founders looking to operate their business in the region
 - Founders whose industry focus lends itself to in-person office
- Communitech would encourage resident founders ready for permanent office space to transition from the Hub
- City staff to facilitate connections to office owners



Reporting Metrics to City of Kitchener

- Quarterly & Annual Reporting
- Based on the metrics for each program
- Relevant to goals of the City's investment:
 - Volume of startups in each program
 - Physical delivery of programming at the Hub
 - Companies graduating from the Hub
 - Companies landing in Downtown Kitchener
 - Overall jobs created for the region



Economic Development Investment Fund 2.0

- \$110 million
 - \$10 million from Reserves
 - \$20 million from Debt Revenue
 - \$80 million from Future Land Sales
- Reserves (\$10 million)
 - \$5 million spent
 - \$2,750,000 allocated/notionally allocated
 - \$2,250,000 unallocated
- Years 1 & 2 Reserves, Years 3 & 4 Future Lands Sales


