Outreach

Anti-Hate Services (AHS)

- ✓ Reporting and documentation service for hate-motivated incidents in Waterloo Region
- Addressing victims' concerns by connecting with appropriate service providers, such as the police, housing managers, school staff, and healthcare professionals.
- ✓ Direct supports for victims such as counselling, legal consultation etc.
- Focused outreach, and education to communities at risk as well as community at large about the importance of recognizing and reporting hate and discrimination and seeking supports.



Key Features of AHS

- Reporting and support for discrimination
- \checkmark First of its kind in Canada at the municipal level
- \checkmark Funded by the municipal government
- \checkmark Operated by the grassroots, racialized community
- \checkmark Alternative option, not a replacement to police data
- ✓ Language interpretation support
- ✓ Anonymous reporting
- ✓ Diverse Reporting channels including WhatsApp
- ✓ Reports from community partners
- ✓ Extensive outreach in diverse communities



Report: Snapshot of Hate in Waterloo Region

- \checkmark Analysis of the data in the annual report
- \checkmark 3rd report just got published in June 2024
- ✓ Data from 2023
- \checkmark 115 = Total reports (26% more than last year)
- \checkmark 43 = Requested supports

A racialized newcomer family was facing harassment from their neighbour who wanted their cat! The neighbour ended up stealing the cat. The family was reluctant to pursue the case with the police but with CMW's support, the case was resolved in their favour. CMW also advocated for language interpretation.

The family appreciated the support in navigating the situation and resolving the matter amicably within two days of intervention. This case underscores the importance of timely communication, interpreter access, and community support for newcomers facing such challenges.



Another case involved a racialized mother with young children who faced ongoing harassment from a neighbor's underage child. Her distress grew as her family endured repeated incidents of vandalism, racist verbal abuse, stone pelting, egg throwing, spitting, and even physical assaults on both adults and children with sticks.

Seeking support, she turned to CMW, which coordinated efforts with the police, Family and Children's Services (FACS), and the neighborhood association. Through this collaborative approach, the issue was
