








approaches to growth





evaluation results

- All three approaches to growth had similar technical evaluation results and broadly align with the evaluation objectives
- Community feedback showed an almost equal preference for all three approaches to growth
- Each approach to growth works for Kitchener and positions the City well for the future






preferred approach to growth

- 4 new "urban centres" at:
 - Highland Road W./Fischer-Hallman Rd.;
 - Ottawa St. N./River Rd.;
 - Strasburg Rd./Block Line Rd.; and
 - Dundee Secondary Plan area.
- Lands on periphery of the City's Protected Major Transit Station areas;
- Along the Ottawa St. Regional Intensification Corridor,
 Weber St. E., and Fischer-Hallman Rd.;
- Homer Watson Blvd./Pioneer Dr.;
- Conestoga College Doon Campus and Homer Watson Blvd./Conestoga College Blvd.





next steps

- Ongoing development of Kitchener 2051 Summer/Early Fall 2025
- First Nations, community, and collaborator engagement on draft Official Plan Fall 2025
- Council Adoption of new Official Plan 2026



recommendation

That the Preferred Approach to Growth as presented in Report DSD-2025-318 be used to inform the development of a draft Official Plan (Kitchener 2051).
